3	To name and locate the surrounding seas of the UK.	Name the surrounding seas of the UK.	Locate the seas using an atlas and label map of the UK with its seas.
4	To know there are four compass directions.	Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West), to describe the location of features and routes on a map.	Discuss four compass points using compasses to orientate maps. Add four compass points to maps.
5	To compare and contrast Warsop to Lincoln.	Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.	Explore the differences between a village and a city. Compare differences in building and resources.
